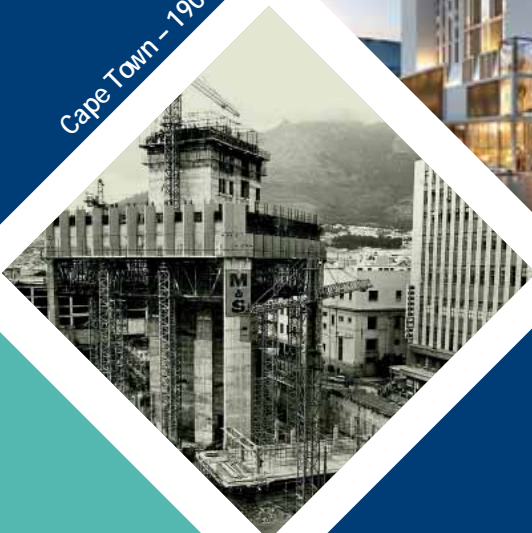
What we do
